RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR 4-H SHOW EXHIBITORS

2024 Clover Classic

Heather Miller: Show Manager

1. Exhibitors must be a 4-H member in grades 4 – 12 as of 1/1/24 and may only show in either Walk/Trot or Walk/Trot/Canter classes. No W/T/C riders will be allowed to show in W/T classes. This rule applies to the rider. No exceptions.
2. Dogs on show grounds must be leashed – no dogs in the arenas.
3. Exhibitors shall act as ladies and gentlemen at all times. It is mandatory that exhibitors be polite, good sportsmen, and properly attired in clean and neat clothing. **Elimination for infraction of this rule shall be at the discretion of the show committee.** Parents and/or chaperones and supporters of an exhibitor must conduct themselves in a proper manner according to 4-H objectives of good sportsmanship and citizenship. **Improper behavior by parent/chaperone and supporters or trainers can result in the elimination of the exhibitor at the discretion of the Show Manger/Committee.**
4. Exhibitor must be responsible for selection, management and care of his/her horse and exhibitor will be responsible for tack, horse and personal items.
5. All horses/ponies must have a minimum Body Condition Score of 4 to show.
6. No stallions will be permitted. Horses shown in performance classes must be at least three years of age as of January 1 of current year.
7. Only authorized persons will be allowed in the show ring. Adults that are not event staff are not allowed in the show ring at any time.
8. Exhibitor must be in proper dress for the classes they are showing in. Boots are required.
9. ASTM approved helmets with chin strap properly fastened are required for **all 4-H youth** while mounted and are considered proper attire for all classes.
10. **No trainers, parents, or other adults are allowed to ride horses on grounds at any time.**
11. Fastening exhibitor's feet/legs to saddle or stirrups WILL NOT BE PERMITTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
12. Judge's decisions are final. Any dispute may be submitted to the show committee in writing.
13. **Parents, chaperones and exhibitors may not address judge/judges concerning rules or judging procedures. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in exhibitor and parent/chaperone/trainer dismissal from show grounds and forfeiture of points accrued by exhibitor.**
14. Proof of negative Coggins test must be presented before unloading horses on the day of show.
15. Every animal must be under control at all times and may be disqualified if considered by the judges and/or the show committee to be in any way undesirable, untrained, unfit, or improperly "turned out." If the show committee or judge deems a horse unsafe, the class will be held until the rider is excused. Also, if the show committee or judge considers a horse too injured or unsound to be ridden, the horse will not be allowed to show and/or asked to be excused. All judges' decisions are final.
16. No changes will be made to classes 5 or 6 after 5:30 PM on Friday or 16 or 17 after 7:30 AM on Saturday. No changes of any class will be made 2 classes prior to the class that is desired to be changed. Scratches are allowed but **no refunds will be made.**
17. Horses entered in the country pleasure classes are only eligible to enter showmanship, halter, equitation, and trail. Exhibitors may show in Western or English attire but not a combination of both.
18. All fence classes are considered canter classes.
19. Exhibitors in jump classes will be allotted 5 minutes to complete the course. Exhibitors will be excused after 5 minutes or 3 refusals.
20. Braiding in the hunter ring is optional.
21. Other rules as detailed in the TN 4-H Horse Show Handbook apply to all competitors.
22. Please keep in mind that the show committee has made every effort to provide a show that will help to prepare 4-H members for the upcoming regional and state shows. Complaints and suggestions should be submitted to the Show committee in writing.
23. High Point Awards will be announced as soon as possible after all classes in the division are complete.
24. The Adopt A Horse is a showmanship class for 4-H'ers who do not have a horse to show in Clover Classic and can borrow one from another exhibitor. They cannot show in any other classes.
25. The show committee members are Danny Bullington, Sharon Davis, Anna Johnson, Charlotte Kinneary, Heather Miller, Jeffrey Oaks and Janicia West.
26. Adopt A Horse Showmanship: Because we have 4-Hers who are in the Horse Project, but do not have a horse, we have this class. A 4-Her can borrow a horse from another 4-Her and show that horse in this class. Grooming is not considered, because the horse has been groomed by the horse's owner. It is strictly showmanship. The 4-Her should have practiced with this horse, so he/she is comfortable with the horse. Exhibitors in this class cannot enter any other classes.

4-H Clover Classic Featured Charity Organization: Mane Support of Roane County



Mane Support is a nonprofit organization that provides a ministry through equine-assisted grief counseling to children and adults who have experienced a death, who are anticipating the death of someone they know, or who have experienced other types of loss. In addition, Mane Support provides education and support to community groups.

Unlike therapeutic riding, 100% of the Mane Support activities are conducted on the ground, giving the program its own distinct capabilities and diversity. Because safety is a primary focus of the program, there are both a clinical and an equine professional with the participants for the full duration of every session. Through interactions with the horses and other structured activities, participants learn problem-solving skills, confidence and team building.

Mane Support offers a wide variety of different groups serving different needs as well as individual sessions. Mane Support uses horses for many reasons. They are strong, magnificent creatures that are honest and live in the moment. They hold no biases against us and never judge us. Interacting with them often allows individuals to overcome intimidation regularly derived from their strength and size. Horses are gifted with the ability to mirror our feelings, allowing the individual insight into ways they may not be aware of how they are reacting to certain situations. Possibly best of all, they are wonderful listeners and teach us many lessons about ourselves.

If you would like to support Mane Support as part of your 4-H Clover Classic experience, there will be a donation box at the registration desk where proceeds will go to support the organization. Additionally, the fees from class with the highest number of participants will be donated to Mane Support.
